Child Abuse Pediatrician Position in Maine

The [Spurwink Center for Safe and Healthy Families](#) is looking to add a full time BC/BE Child Abuse Pediatrician to our well-established multidisciplinary team. This position entails evaluations in our outpatient clinic as well as inpatient consultations at the Barbara Bush Children's Hospital in Portland, ME.

The Team and Our Services

The Center serves children throughout Maine as the only child abuse program in the state. Our program currently consists of a child abuse pediatrician, Dr. Amanda Brownell, two experienced NPs, forensic interviewers, doctoral level psychologists, and behavioral health services including TF-CBT. Annually the Center evaluates approximately 1200 children.

The Center provides both inpatient and outpatient evaluations for physical and sexual abuse as well as a multidisciplinary failure to thrive clinic. Our Center is one of only three in the state to provide comprehensive evaluations of children newly entering foster care. Our Center houses the Cumberland County Child Advocacy Center and provides medical evaluations for children seen at all of Maine's CAC.

Advocacy and Academic Opportunities

The Center is closely affiliated with [The Barbara Bush Children's Hospital](#), an affiliate of Tufts University School of Medicine and the only children's hospital in Maine. The Center provides education for physicians, residents, medical students, child welfare workers, mental health and law enforcement professionals. The Center currently provides 24/7 statewide child abuse medical consultation.

This position offers a unique opportunity to develop services for the children of Maine and to have a real impact on policy and practice throughout the state. Academic appointment through Tufts University School of medicine commensurate with training and experience is available.

Child Abuse Pediatrician - University of Chicago's Department of Pediatrics

The University of Chicago's Department of Pediatrics, Section of Academic Pediatrics, is searching for a child abuse pediatrician. The successful applicant will be a full-time faculty member, contribute to patient care, medical education, and scholarship, and join a vibrant, diverse, and distinguished community of faculty colleagues and students and:

- Provide consultation within an established interdisciplinary process and participate in court-related activities as needed.
- Support the Multidisciplinary Pediatric Education and Evaluation Consortium (MPEEC) program by providing real-time expert medical consultation to child welfare and law enforcement for a mandated population of children who are reported for serious harm. The program is managed by University of Chicago Comer Children's Hospital Child Advocacy and Protective Services (CAPS) program staff, and case coordination is supported by a full-time MPEEC investigations coordinator. MPEEC is a national landmark program and has received state support for over 18 years.
- Train pediatric residents during the required one-month rotation, which includes morning reports, grand rounds, medical school courses and the MPEEC quarterly seminars.
- Provide lectures and grand rounds to regional hospitals and medical centers, as well as community partners such as state's attorneys, law enforcement and child welfare investigators.
- Participate in hospital committee efforts such as QI projects and programmatic and policy development related to child abuse medicine.

The University of Chicago Medical Center is designated as a both a Level 1 Adult and Pediatric Trauma Center and operates a nationally-recognized burn unit. Comer Children's Hospital is an integrated children's hospital that offers a full complement of pediatric services with a total of 172 general pediatric, NICU and PICU beds. The Comer Children's CAPS program was established in 1991 and has a national reputation as a leader in the medical care of abused and neglected children. The CAPS program is primarily a hospital-based consultation service. The core CAPS team comprises 2 CAP board-certified physicians, a physician assistant, a clinical social worker, and full-time administrative support.

Prior to the start of employment, qualified applicants must: 1) have a medical doctorate or equivalent, 2) hold or be eligible for medical licensure in the State of Illinois, and 3) be Board certified or eligible in Child Abuse Pediatrics.

2. SPARK Clinic: administrative/clinical supervision of SPARK, medical home for children in foster care in SCC.

3. Youth Clinic: participate in administration of transitional age youth clinic, serving teens and young adults who were previously in foster care or the juvenile justice system and other high risk youth.

Administrative Responsibilities

1. Support collaborative efforts to establish a Child Advocacy Center in SCC.

2. Chair Child Abuse Prevention Committee, internal to SCVMC's cross-disciplinary team that evaluates quality of abuse evaluations across SCVHHS, and supports educational efforts.

3. Supervise maintenance of data base re: child physical/sexual abuse evaluations.

4. Provide ongoing education and develop educational materials for clinical staff regarding signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect.

5. Provide annual training for the pediatric and emergency departments regarding mandatory reporting requirements.

6. Collaborate with community partners to develop a centralized trauma-informed resource for children in foster care to monitor medication practices, school behavior interventions, and school disciplinary practices.

7. Represent SCVMC on county-wide organizations who advocate for children's health and safety.
